

Headteachers Weekly Update 24.01.2025

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a great week. I'll dive straight into the key things for this week.

PTFA AGM: As you will have seen, the Annual General Meeting for the PTFA will be held on **Wednesday 12th February at 3:30pm**. We are able to look after your children who attend our school (not pre-school or secondary school children) during the meeting to help enable you to attend. It would be great to see lots of you there as committee members are voted for and appointed and for as many parents as possible to get involved in lots of ways big or small. Holocaust Memorial Day Service: On **Wednesday 29th January** (next week), pupils in Year 4, 5 and 6 will be leading our annual Holocaust Memorial Day Service at the Abbey at 2:15pm. The rest of the school will remain in school. It is always a very poignant and important service and we will be joined by the Mayor of Test Valley. Parents are welcome to join us if you would like to attend.

Suez Recycling: Kirsty from Suez Recycling joined us for Collective Worship yesterday and shared about how we can all make a huge difference by developing good habits with regards to recycling and waste. She was particularly keen to share the great value of ensuring food waste is put in specific food waste bins and the energy that can be generated from this. We have specific food waste bins in school and Kirsty encouraged the children to think about what they do with their food waste at home. We can make a huge difference if we are all ready to play our part in looking after the world we have been given.

INSET Day: Next Friday (31st January) is an INSET day so school will be closed to children whilst staff complete training and development together. Our focus for this INSET day is **SEND: inclusive and adaptive teaching** and the **Power of Story across the curriculum**.
