

Head Teacher Update 5th July 2024

Dear Parents and Carers,

Good afternoon one and all. I hope you have had a good week. As we hit July, it is a busy and exciting time in school in readiness for the end of the school year. It was great to hear that our Year 6 pupils had a fantastic day at their new secondary schools on Wednesday. The other classes enjoyed the chance to spend time with their new teachers in their new classrooms. We are looking forward to the new chapter starting in September. Over the coming days and weeks, we will continue to support the transition, helping children to go into the summer holidays feeling ready to start confidently in their new class on Tuesday 3rd September.

Creativity: Our focus Habit of Mind is Creativity this half term and we continue to think about what it means to have a creative mindset and approach in all we do. We want the children to grow in wisdom and confidence in weighing up possibilities and options so that they are equipped to make good and courageous decisions.
